Long Range Planning

Good morning, Lions.

I have been assigned the job of representing our district, 26M2 as the Long-Range Planning representative. I think in light of the recent revelation that our Multiple-District (which is comprised of 7 districts) does not have a single district with a membership count above 1250. This is the number at which the Lions International consider a district to be at a minimum number. I would like us to step up and begin asking ourselves, how can we address this? I for one do not want to see the Lions of our district, with all of the services we provide, begin to disappear. One thing I believe is that if we disappear, we will not do it suddenly, it will be, slowly. It's apparent to me that we are on that slow path. The good news is that since it's slow, we will be able to wrest the problem into control. All we have to do is simply take action. The not simple part is what action shall be taken?

We had a report at our cabinet meeting last evening that told us that more Lions are leaving the organization that are in "good standing" than any other reason. This suggests that we have Lions leaving the organization that are willing to remain as Lions despite the hard work and having to pay dues but are not willing to remain Lions for some other reason. I think this means that we may be failing to understand what their reasons for being a Lion were and we are not helping them to meet their goals and objectives.

With that in mind please do the following. Look into your heart, find thoughtful responses, and answer these two questions.

What would make you feel like you must leave the Lions?

What would keep you from leaving the Lions?

After you have your thoughts, please share them with me.





Correct Operating Procedures for this year for processing requests. The Correct Operating Procedure is noted as follows:

- 1. The call comes in to the Hot Line and the requestor is directed to the 26M2 Lions website https://lions26m2.org/resources.html for eye care and hearing resources.
- 2. The requestor completes the required form and sends it to the address noted on the form.
- 3. Request is received at the LAS Post Office Box.
- 4. The request is reviewed for completeness.
- 5. The reviewed request is logged and forwarded to the LAS to be assigned to a local club.
- 6. The LAS chair forwards the request to the club or club closest to the geographical location.
- 7. The assigned club reviews and accepts the request to be processed (or denies due to budgetary issues)
 - a. If denied by the Local Club the LAS will direct to the closest club in that geographical area.
- 8. The assigned club reports back to the LAS regarding the status of the request.
 - a. Assigned
 - b. In progress
 - c. Forwarded
 - d. Closed (Complete)
- 9. If <u>ANY</u> Lions club receives an independent request <u>OUTSIDE</u> of the LAS line, please contact the LAS chair with the following information.
 - a. Date received
 - b. Requestors Name
 - c. ZIP CODE
 - d. Club Name assisting
 - e. Date of completion

Constitution and By-Laws Report February 7, 2022

At the District 26-M2 Convention on March 5, 2022 the certified delegates will be voting on the Lions to fill the offices of District Governor 2022-2023, First Vice District Governor, Second Vice District Governor, a Representative to the District 26-M2 Lions Eye Foundation and a Director for Saving Sight.

There aren't any changes to the District 26-M2 Constitution and By-Laws at this time that require a vote by the Delegates at this Convention.

We are waiting for the Club membership information to be received from LCI and the Club Delegate/Alternate Credential Certificate forms will be finalized and will be sent to each Club Secretary via email. The number of delegates and alternates a Club is entitled to is based on the number of members in good standing for a year and a day as of February 1, 2022.

Delegates of Clubs with unpaid balances due to Lions Clubs International (LCI) cannot vote at the District Convention if the past due amount is not paid and good standing acquired up to fifteen (15) days prior to the close of credential certification. This is by end of day February 18, 2022.

THERE IS NO EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE.

Any payments received less than 15 days prior to credential certification will not change the voting status of the club, and the delegates of that Club will not be allowed to vote at the Convention.

Once your Club receives this form, please make sure your Club fills out with their delegates and alternates names and have the form returned as quickly as possible to Cabinet Secretary Toni Mahoney.

Also, there are several issues on the ballot at the State Convention in April.

Our committee met via e-mail Dec 23-Dec 24 final review of proposed amendments to the Multiple District 26 Constitution and By-Laws and wording of Propositions to be voted upon at the Multiple District Convention on April 30, 2022and update. Responding for approval were: *This portion to be completed after the meeting closes*.

The review and Propositions are in attachment 1 to this report.

Again, as we mentioned in October, while it does not directly affect to the Multiple District Constitution and By-Laws, nor the seated Governors, the Vice District Governors need to take note of some major changes for 2022-2023 which will affect their appointment of Zone and Region Chairpersons.

Part I: MD 26 Constitution and By-Laws April 30, 2022

Updates (Annual Routine)

Date of document, C & BL Committee, Table of Contents to agree with approved final. (Automatic, no vote required.)

Updates (Per La-5 2021-2022)

By-Laws, Article III: Add new Section 9 (Leo-Leo Lion Council Liaison (Optional) and re-letter all following Sections. (*Automatic, no vote required.*)

Proposition 1 – Delete words printed in RED strikethru.

Constitution, Article VIII, Section 2 (State Committees):

(d) *State Marketing Communications Committee* --- It shall be the duty of this Committee to supervise all public relations for the Multiple District 26 and to supervise the publishing of the Multiple District 26 news bulletin. The Council with recommendations of the Committee shall appoint an Editor who shall administer the actual printing and distribution of the news bulletin.

Justification: Remove the cost of printing and postage.

Requires two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote to pass.

Proposition 2 – Delete words printed in **RED** strikethru. Add words printed in **BLUE** underline.

Constitution, Article VIII, Section 2 (State Committees):

(e) Missouri Lions All State Band Committee --- It shall be the duty of this Committee to supervise the conduct and operation of the Missouri Lions All State Band. This Committee, with the approval of the Council, shall set policy for the Band, shall determine the functions at which the Band shall perform, shall administer the Missouri Lions All State Band Fund with the approval of the Council, and shall elect a Chief Band Director who shall administer and conduct the Band. The Chief Band Director shall as part of his duties administer any funds allotted to him by the Council. He shall be bonded to cover the maximum cost of the funds entrusted to him. The cost of such bond shall be paid out of the Missouri Lions All State Band Fund. The Committee with the approval of the Council may appoint from time to time such Band Directors as the Committee deems appropriate to assist the Chief Director in the administration and conduction of the Band. The funds necessary to finance the expenses procurement of the band, such as uniforms, music, travel, board and lodging for rehearsals and engaging in approved performances, shall be obtained from the Missouri Lions All State Band Fund and through grants made by Lions Clubs and others sponsoring band members in accordance with the procedures established by the Council. It shall be the duty of the Chief Band Director, with the approval of the Council, to store, maintain and preserve any and all equipment, including uniforms, used by the Band from time to time.

Justification: Update operation of the Missouri Lions All-State Band.

Requires two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote to pass.

Proposition 3 – Delete words printed in **RED** strikethru. Add words printed in **BLUE** underline.

Constitution, Article VIII, Section 2 (State Committees):

(k) State Athletic Committee --- In addition to the members appointed by the District Governors the committee may itself appoint advisors to help carry out its charge. Advisors are not entitled to vote or to reimbursements for mileage expenses without prior approval by the Council. The State Athletic Committee shall be responsible for all athletic events of this Multiple District. the annual All-State All-Star Football Game. The committee shall prepare a budget for each event the game for council approval, and shall identify the designation for funds in the budget. The committee shall make regular reports, including financial reports, to the Council. A detailed financial report shall be given to the Council at its fall meeting. Net funds generated by this committee shall be donated to any approved projects, programs and supported organizations of Multiple District 26, per the Multiple District 26 Policy Manual.

Justification: Update operation of the State Athletic Committee.

Requires two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote to pass.

Requires two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote to pass.

Proposition 6 - Four Areas as depicted:

Delete words printed in **RED** strikethrough. Add words printed in **BLUE** underline.

- [1]- Multiple District By-Laws Article VIII, Section 2 (a) and (b)
- (a) Ten dollars and fifty cents (\$10.50 [\$12.00 if the exception in Section 1 (a) has been invoked]) per member of the annual per capita tax shall be forwarded by the District Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer and shall be divided in the following proportions and placed in the following funds by the State Council Secretary-Treasurer: Seventy cents (\$0.70) per year in the International Convention Fund; Eight dollars and seventy cents (\$8.70) per year in the State Administrative Fund; Seventy cents (\$0.70) per year in the Youth Leadership Activities Fund Missouri Lions All-State Band Fund; and forty cents (\$0.40) per year in the International Candidates' Election Fund except when the condition in Section 1(a) is invoked the International Candidates' Election Fund will receive one dollar and ninety cents (\$1.90) per year.
- (b) Six dollars (\$6.00) per member of a Campus Club the annual per capita tax shall be forwarded to the State Council Secretary-Treasurer and shall be divided in the following proportions and placed in the following funds by the State Council Secretary-Treasurer: forty cents (\$0.40) per year in the International Convention Fund; five dollars (\$5.00) per year in the State Administrative Fund; forty cents (\$0.40) per year in the Youth Leadership Activities Fund Missouri Lions All-State Band Fund; and twenty (\$0.20) per year in the International Candidates' Election Fund.
- [2]- Multiple District By-Laws Article VIII, Section 5. Missouri Lions All State Band Fund. This fund shall be used to pay the authorized and necessary expenses of the Missouri Lions All State Band as defined in Article VIII, Section 2 (e) hereof until this fund is depleted; then, they may request funds from the Youth Leadership Activities Fund.
- [3]- Multiple District By-Laws Article VIII, Section 6 (New). Youth Leadership Activities Fund. Expenses of the youth related committees, which consist of the band, athletic, and Lions Opportunities for Youth Committees may request operating funds from the Youth Leadership Activities Fund as specified in the Policy Manual.


